

Welcome to Columbia Dog Park! Off-leash activities are permitted during regular Park hours only. You enter this area at your own risk & liability. For the safety & well-being of all visitors and dogs, we thank you for adhering to the following rules.

Requirements for Dogs:

- Dogs must be kept on-leash outside of the Dog Park fence boundary at all times.
- Dogs must display tags showing proof of current license & vaccinations for Rabies.
 Vaccinations against canine Parvovirus & Bordetella are strongly encouraged. Puppies should have received a complete series of vaccinations before entering.
- Dogs that have a history of aggression toward people and/or other dogs should not be brought into the dog park.
- Dogs must display safe & appropriate social interactions; any dogs displaying aggressive behavior toward people and/or other dogs must be leashed and removed from the area immediately.

Requirements for Handlers:

- Promptly pick up & dispose of your dog's waste in appropriate containers.
- Do not litter.
- Do not leave food in the dog park or feed someone else's dog without the owner's permission.
- Carry a leash not longer than 8' in length at all times for each dog in your care. No spike, choke, electric, or prong collars are allowed on dogs in the dog park.
- Closely supervise children. Children under 16 years old must be accompanied by an adult, and it is recommended that children under 10 years old not enter the dog park.
- Do not allow your dog to chase, harass, harm, or kill wildlife (including squirrels).
- Handlers accept responsibility & liability for any damage or injury caused by their dog.
- Do not leave your dog unattended or unsupervised inside the off-leash area.
- Keep your dog within your view and under your verbal control at all times.
- You must be capable of promptly gaining and maintaining physical control of your dog if the need arises. Handlers must be sixteen (16) years of age or older.
- Do not bring more than 3 dogs with you to the off-leash area at a time.
- Do not bring a dog in heat to this Dog Park, or to any other Troutdale City Park.
- Handlers must comply with all other Park rules, as well as City & County codes.
- Immediately report dog bites to the Multnomah County Sheriff's Office (503-988-6788) or Multnomah County Animal Services (503-988-7387).

Please treat all park visitors with respect and courtesy. Multnomah County Animal Services, Multnomah County Sheriff's Deputies and/or City of Troutdale Staff have the authority to enforce Leash & Scoop laws, including citation and park exclusion.
