## Parking Standards

# BEFORE YOU PARK...

Parking a vehicle illegally could result in a parking citation. The following are illegal parking methods you should avoid:

- Parking within 20ft of a cross walk
- Parking within 50ft of a stop sign
- Parking within 10ft of a mail receptacle
- Parking on grass or exposed soil
- Parking a vehicle which appears inoperative or disabled, wrecked, dismantled or junked
- Parking a vehicle with no license plate, expired license plates or an expired temporary permit
- Parking a vehicle in excess of 96 hours



## Parking in any of the following manners may cause your vehicle to be **TOWED** without prior notice!

- If you have a **hazardous vehicle**, meaning a vehicle left in a location or condition such as to constitute an immediate and continuous threat to public health and safety, the environment or the safety of vehicular or pedestrian traffic.
- Parking your vehicle in any manner which obstructs or **blocks any portion of another person's driveway**
- Parking within 10ft of or blocking a **fire hydrant**
- Parking **across a sidewalk or crosswalk**.  
No vehicles or other objects may obstruct any portion of a sidewalk or crosswalk at any time.
- Parking so **tires are more than 12 inches from the curb**. Curb side tires, front and rear, must be within 12 inches of the curb or roadside and facing the direction of travel.
- Park a vehicle which **appears to be inoperative** or disabled, wrecked or dismantled or junked.
- Parking a vehicle in a park after park closure.
- Parking within 20 ft of a **cross walk**
- Parking within 50 ft of a **stop sign**
- Parking within an **intersection**
- Parking a vehicle which has three (3) or more **unpaid parking tickets**.

- Parking or standing an **unattended semi-tractor, or semi-trailer**, on any street. An attended semi may park while loading or unloading.
- Parking or standing a vehicle or leaving a vehicle parked or standing upon any street or public right-of-way for the principal purpose of:
  - **Repairing or servicing** a vehicle;
  - **Displaying advertising** from the vehicle;
  - **Selling merchandise** from the vehicle;
  - or
  - Offering the **vehicle for sale**
- Parking or standing a vehicle, trailer, boat or combination of vehicles, including trailers, boats, trucks, truck tractors, buses, mobile homes, motor homes and campers, which **exceeds** 21ft in length, 8ft in height or exceeds 8,000lbs gross weight.
- **Recreational vehicles**, unless issued a permit; Utility trailers and boats, motor homes, may be parked on a street for four (4) hours while actively loading and unloading.
